- READ THE FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT/RFP/NOFO BEFORE YOU ANSWER EACH QUESTION. MAKE SURE TO ADDRESS ALL POINTS DIRECTLY.
- ATTEND/LISTEN TO RECORDINGS OF INFORMATIONAL GRANT WEBINARS OR TRAININGS. REACH OUT TO PROGRAM STAFF TO ASK QUESTIONS, IF POSSIBLE.
- DEVELOP A COMPLETE AND DETAILED PROPOSAL THAT ALIGNS CLOSELY WITH THE PROGRAM PRIORITIES.
- CLEARLY EXPLAIN THE ISSUE, HOW YOU PROPOSE TO ADDRESS IT WITH THE REQUESTED FUNDING, AND HOW YOU WILL MEASURE SUCCESS.
- ENSURE YOUR GOALS, BUDGET AND TIMELINE ARE REALISTIC, DETAILED, AND ARE IN ALIGNMENT. BE MINDFUL OF FUNDING LEVELS AND GRANT PERIOD RESTRICTIONS.
- REVIEW SCORING CRITERIA TO COMPARE YOUR PROJECT TO PROGRAM GOALS.
- INCLUDE ONLY RELEVANT DOCUMENTATION, REPORTS AND/OR DATA.
